Following is a *partial* list of other Virginia laws related to a finding of incapacity of a person and the effect of the finding on voting, guns, and driving. The provisions are paraphrased; refer to the actual citation for exact text. Not listed are the laws to establish incapacity or the fiduciary accounting rules. *See also* the duties of the Clerk of Circuit Court to record, index and notify: §37.2-1014

Law (subject)	Paraphrased Provisions
Virginia Constitution Art II §1 <i>(Voting)</i>	“As prescribed by law, no person adjudicated to be mentally incompetent shall be qualified to vote until his competency has been reestablished.”
Virginia Code 24.2-410 <i>(Voting)</i>	Clerk of the Circuit Court to send the State Board of Elections a list of persons declared incompetent under 37.2-1000 <i>et seq</i> , and therefore “‘mentally incompetent’ for purposes under this title”, unless a Court order specifically provides otherwise.
Virginia Code 24.2-418 <i>(Voting)</i>	Application for registration to vote has to include statement whether person applying to register to vote has ever been declared incapacitated.
Virginia Code 46.2-314 <i>(Driving)</i>	No license to drive may be issued to a person adjudged incapacitated or who has been released from mental hospital.
Virginia Code 46.2-400 <i>(Driving)</i>	The DMV, on receipt of notice that a person found incapacitated per 37.2-1000 <i>et seq</i> , or discharged from mental hospital, shall forthwith suspend their license to drive.
Virginia Code 18.2-308 J4 <i>(Guns)</i>	An Incapacitated person cannot get a permit for concealed weapons
Virginia Code 18.2-308.1:2 & 1:3 <i>(Guns)</i>	An Incapacitated person or person involuntarily committed (mental health warrant) cannot purchase, possess or transport firearms
Virginia Code 58.1-3015 <i>(Real Estate Taxation)</i>	Real Property owned by an incapacitated person “to be listed by and taxed to their guardian or conservator.”
Virginia Code 37.2-1011 & -1014 <i>(Recording Order)</i>	Clerk of Court shall record Guardianship Order “in manner a Power of Attorney” is recorded (-1011) and index it in the deed records (-1014)
